The Spirit of Jesus Helps Us

FOCUS: In this chapter, you will be helping your child to understand that the Holy Spirit helps us examine our consciences and become better people.

The Holy Spirit is with us always, but we are not always sensitive to his presence. Just as photographic film captures elusive and fleeting impressions when it is carefully exposed to light, the human heart detects delicate and seemingly imperceptible movements of grace when it is closely attuned to the Holy Spirit.

In George Bernard Shaw's play *St. Joan*, King Charles asks Joan why she is granted heavenly revelations and he is not. Joan answers, "They do come to you, but you do not hear them. You have not sat in the field in the evening, listening for them." The inspirations of the Holy Spirit illuminate the various ways we hinder God's action in our lives. Only if we come into the healing presence of our God will we see ourselves reflected as we truly are. The more receptive we are to the Holy Spirit in our lives, the more we will experience the fruits of his presence.
